



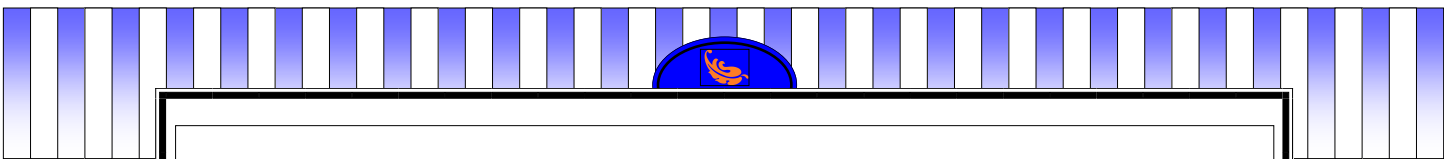

Greetings in the name of Christ!

This month we will find ourselves getting ready for family get togethers, tables full of turkey, and THANKSGIVING. It has been one of this chubby preacher's favorite holidays for years. As a child we would all gather around the table and each of us would tell what we were thankful for.

As I have grown up, I find the things I am thankful for have changed dramatically. First off, they aren't "things" at all. We all are of course very thankful for our family (even that crazy uncle) and friends (even that one your mom still doesn't like), food, shelter, etc. But what are we *most* thankful for. What is that one thing we are thankful for, that makes all the other things possible? I am sure you can see where I am going with this.

Our scripture is full of giving thanks in the psalms, but for me and for many, Psalm 23 is the one I love.

David wrote "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake." These words are familiar to each of us, but we would do well to consider them once again. This time though, don't consider the world in which you know, but instead consider the world the psalmist lived.

For us, green pastures are a common sight, as are still waters, but in the land in which David lived, both of these things were a rarity. 
Recognition from Joe Manchin United States Senator
